Friends of Munch

Wednesday, June 28th, 18.00 / Risør Church

Edvard Munch had many friends in various artistic circles, many of them composers and musicians. At this concert you will experience the music Munch himself listened to, music inspired by his art, and music written by his close friends. Fredrick Delius' and Edvard Munch's first meeting was documented by a drawing in the newspaper *Verdens Gang* (VG) after a concert in Kristiania (later called Oslo) October 10th, 1891. They became good friends, sent countless cards and letters, and Delius became a real 'friend of Norway'. Christian Sindig had a very good relationship with Munch, even though, according to Munch, he thought the colours in the Aula murals were a bit much the first time he saw them. Conversely, one who was wild about these colours was Richard Strauss. After a concert in the Aula he is supposed to have said, "Your paintings express exactly what I am trying to do in my compositions."

Schubertiad

Thursday, June 29th, 18.00 / Risør Church

The concert program presents songs of Schubert, Beethoven, and Vaughan Williams, surrounded by and commented on by the five movements from Schubert's *String Quintet in A-Major*, also known as *Die Forelle*, "The Trout".

In the spirit of a «Schubertiad», i.e. a series of private musical evenings celebrating Schubert's work, Alice Sara Ott performs with musical friends.

Schubert's *Trout Quintet* is one of the most popular chamber music works of all time. The piece gets its name from the fourth movement, which is comprised of variations on one of Schubert's own songs, "The Trout". However, Schubert does not quote the passage where the fish is caught, and the piece is counted among the composer's most light and lively.

Schubert builds bridges between folk music, salon music, and Romanticism, and this is reflected in the programming of the concert: between each movement comes songs by Beethoven and Vaughan Williams – in addition to Schubert's own, sung by the baritone Benjamin Appl – already considered an authority on art song despite his young age.

The baritone Benjamin Appl is celebrated by both audiences and critics alike, and has been described by *The Financial Times* as "the most promising of today's up-and-coming song recitalists". Now he brings some of his favorite songs by Schubert, Kurtag, and Vaughan Williams to Frelsesarmeen, accompanied by the pianist Alice Sara Ott and violinist Thomas Reif. This promises to be a rare and beautiful, intimate concert.

The summer of 1885 brought the artists Harriet Backer and Kitty Kielland to Risør. Backer's brother was a priest in town, and the two women made good use of their visit: Backer — - who was also sister of the composer and pianist Agathe Backer Grøndahl — painted *Rødt hus* (Red House) in Bosvik, while Kielland's brushstrokes resulted in *Etter Solnedgang* (After Sunset) — a work cited as the introduction of Neo-Romanticism to Norway.

With the new age came as well the author Arne Garborg, also with a connection to Risør; he was a teacher in Søndeled. Perhaps he noticed the boat sailing out of the strait one late afternoon, carrying – according to the story – a sleeping Gustav Mahler below deck?

Risør leaves its mark and runs like a red thread through this concert: with selected piano pieces by Agathe Backer Grøndahl, *Haugtussa* by Grieg and Garborg, Mahler's *Piano Quartet in A minor* — in addition to sea-composer Benjamin Britten's *Variations on a Theme by Frank Bridge* — the stage is set for a concert in the spirit of neo-Romanticism.

Three Giants

On January 1st, 1888, Edvard Grieg, Johannes Brahms, and Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky met at the home of Anna Brodsky and her husband in Leipzig. Tchaikovsky wrote in his diary that evening. He describes Brahms as a very short man with a likeable appearance, a simple way of being, with down-to-earth humor, and without vanity. He described the meeting with Grieg asvery special and deep, one that later developed into a genuine friendship, based on the love of two musical cultures, even if they didn't know each other's music so well. Anna Brodsky wrote an

account of everything that happened that evening, of Tchaikovsky's modesty, of Grieg and his wife Nina's warmth, and of Brahms – who wouldn't give up a jar of strawberry jam. What an evening it must have been!
