## 15.00 **Nadia Boulanger's Wednesday Class** Risør Church (65min)

Risør Church opens its doors for "Nadia Boulanger's Wednesday Class", a 65-minute tribute to the legendary pedagogue whose Parisian salon sculpted the musical titans of the modern era. Nadia Boulanger, celebrated for her pedagogical genius from 1887 to 1979, was renowned not only for her teachings but also for the intimate music salons she hosted, a beacon of cultural and musical exchange. Amidst the shadowed elegance of her apartment, a grand church organ stood as a testament to her stature, echoing the notes of future maestros.

This session delves into the essence of Boulanger's Wednesday gatherings, which evolved beyond mere musical soirées to become a crucible for composers, offering a platform for premieres and the invaluable opportunity to be seen and heard.

In a tribute to Boulanger's unparalleled legacy, we shall traverse her musical journey alongside her sister Lili, through a narrative woven by Leonard Bernstein, Philip Glass, and Astor Piazzolla. This performance promises a glimpse into the uncharted territories of music, featuring the premiere of a piece by Norwegian composer Andreas Gundersen.

#### 20.00 A Soldier's Tale

IGOR STRAVINSKY (1882–1971)

The turn of the 20th century saw the rapid spread of the Chaminade Music Club phenomenon, with some of these chamber music clubs still in existence today. At their peak, there were 1,500 such clubs across the USA, each named after the French style icon of the 1900s: composer and concert performer Cécile Chaminade.

After all, it was the salons of homes where women's music-making predominantly took place. In the home of Brita and Jan Egil, we allow the esteemed Virginia Woolf to articulate the significance of having "A Room of One's Own." With women's suffrage on the horizon, Virginia Woolf debates the status quo with her contemporaries, female composers Germaine Tailleferre, Ethel Smyth, and the superstar Cécile Chaminade.
